We plan to livestream the program, so for those who are too far away to be with us or cannot be for other reasons, you don't have to miss out on the fun.

We will be bringing back many activities from former years like great African food, information tables, a photo booth and letter writing station for letters to your Ahadi Kids or Grandmas, and a program which will include video greetings from our Uganda Director, Grace.

PROJECT FUNDING GOALS FOR THE 2021 FUNDRAISER BANQUET

Our fundraising goals for this year's banquet are to raise funds to fulfill a particular need for each of the three major projects currently underway. At the <u>Grandma Village</u>, we are making great progress having completed four of six duplexes for homeless Grandmas to move into. Within the next few weeks, several of those destitute Grandmas will move into a home that is beautiful, spacious and beyond their wildest dreams for themselves. The fundraising goal in this area is to build them a gazebo for a gathering place and to complete the planting of a garden area for them with such crops as potatoes, corn, cassava, tomatoes and banana trees. The amount needed is about <u>\$5,000</u>.

At the <u>Rwengoma Office Sustainability Project</u>, we moved the ChristAid Uganda staff into the left side of the ground floor of the new building in June of 2020 just as the serious lockdowns got even tighter in Uganda. Our current goal for this project is to finish the banquet room on the ground floor across from the employee offices.

The rentable "Banquet Hall" and adjacent bathrooms will cost about \$12,400 to complete which includes lighting, wall finish, cabinets, plumbing and bathroom fixtures. This will allow for the first potential income producing event for this project. What a celebration that will be!!

Additionally, we hope to raise another $\underline{\$6,350}$ to finish the "common area" between the employee offices and the banquet hall. This will require ceiling finish, paint, glass entrance doors and flooring for the area leading to the banquet hall from the front door of the building.

The third major project underway at ChristAid is <u>outfitting the new Secondary School</u> for a May 2022 grand opening date. (Subject to Covid regulations by the Ugandan government at that time.) Currently, an existing nearby building is being modified for a student dining hall and library. Also, a required security fence will soon be constructed with funds on hand.

The fundraising goal for this project is to fill the library with exciting books and great literature for the hungry minds of our secondary students. We need an additional \$11,500 to prepare the library. (See below...new pictures just received of school furnishings in place.)









If you passed math class in YOUR school (or even if you didn't), you might have added the total for our various project fundraising goals to be \$35,250. We are believing God's hand is on each of these projects to move it forward and make it happen. Would you like to help a student attend the new ChristAid Secondary School (being opened in her backyard) who will otherwise not have the slightest chance to do so? Sofiati Mohamad is 14 years old and has somehow managed to attend school reaching the S2 level (second year of Secondary school) despite a desperate living situation at home. She is one of six siblings who stay with their aunt after losing her mother to Cancer and HIV in 2020. Their father has abandoned them.

Sofiati loves biology and dreams of being a doctor to help people and make a good living to support others in her family. She enjoys Biology and works very hard at school. She is praying for help from God and a supporter to help her get back to school. Meet Grandma Edith Nyindo Murungi, who at the age of 77 finds herself as the only bread winner for four of her grandchildren and one daughter who is mentally and physically incapable of caring for the kids. The family survives by eating "matooke" (banana mash) and selling the excess bananas from their banana plantation to buy other food staples. Grandma Edith has health issues including high blood pressure, varicose veins, joint pain and general weakness. Sponsoring Grandma Edith for \$35 a



month would provide her with health care and necessary medications, as well as funds for better nutrition for herself and the family. At the banquet there will be a sponsorship table with materials to sponsor Edith and other Grandmas. They are patiently waiting for rescue!

While many of the ChristAid Primary School students have not been able to attend class during this covid year, the "Primary 7" classes were allowed to return to the Uganda schools near the end of the term, to prepare for the "PLE - Primary Leaving Exam". This testing ranks the scholastic achievement of our P7 students against all others in Uganda.

As is usually the case, <u>our kids have shown like the sun on these tests!</u>! Of the 54 who participated in the week-long testing, 28 scored at the highest level and 26 in the second level. (This might not sound like a big deal unless you know that there <u>are</u> levels 3 and 4... and none of our kids scored in those categories!!). WE ARE SO EXCITED FOR THEM and pleased for what it means for our school.

Our teachers worked very hard to achieve this end. It was a blessing that ChristAid was able to send them partial salaries some months and full salaries other months during the covid shut down of the school, to help them survive the lock down situation. We also sent what would usually be considered "tuition" money for the kids, directly to the families of all our sponsored students for life support during this time of critical need.
